Release date and availability in the UK

iPhone 17 was officially announced in September 2025. Pre-orders in the UK opened 12 September 2025, and official availability began on 19 September 2025. The device is sold through Apple's own UK online and physical stores, as well as via authorised carriers and retailers. This ensures that whether you want a SIM-free model or a contract plan, there are multiple ways to buy it.

Official Apple Store UK pricing & storage options

For UK buyers, Apple has made some notable changes this year. The baseline storage for iPhone 17 has been doubled: the entry-level model now starts at 256 GB rather than 128 GB in previous generations. This means more space for apps, photos, video, without paying a big premium for higher storage. According to Apple's UK store, pricing is as follows:

- iPhone 17 (standard) — starts at £799 for 256 GB storage
- iPhone 17 — 512 GB storage option available (with higher price than base; Apple UK lists 512 GB tier)

Apple has also introduced new models alongside the base iPhone 17: , and . The lineup uses 256 GB as the starting storage across all models — 128 GB is no longer offered. Estimated UK prices for these models start higher, reflecting their advanced hardware and storage configurations.

What you get for £799: iPhone 17 standard model features

For £799, the standard iPhone 17 gives you a modern smartphone that, compared to previous generations, offers significant upgrades:

- A faster and more efficient processor — the new A19 chip — delivering improved performance and responsiveness.
- A 120Hz ProMotion display with brighter, more vivid visuals and better scratch resistance, making daily use smoother and more comfortable.
- A 48 MP Dual Fusion camera system, which greatly improves photo and video quality over older models. There's also a new front-facing camera with "Centre Stage" for smarter selfies and video calls.
- All-day battery life and faster charging support, along with updated software (latest iOS version) and support for upcoming Apple updates for several years.

- More storage out of the box — 256 GB — meaning less need to worry about space for photos, videos, apps or updates.

Given all that, £799 represents a reasonably competitive price for what you get: a flagship-class iPhone with modern hardware and future-proof storage.

Why Apple raised base storage—and what it means for buyers

By making 256 GB the default, Apple acknowledges changing user habits. Photos, 4K videos, apps with richer content, and increasing OS sizes all demand more space. Previously, users often had to pay extra to get enough storage. Now, with the base model offering 256 GB, buyers get more value without needing to overspend. This simplifies the choice, and reduces the risk of running out of space soon after purchase.

Comparing to carrier deals and contract options

Not everyone wants to pay upfront. In the UK, carriers and retailers offer contract-based payment plans, often bundling data services and discounts. Monthly plans usually involve a fixed upfront payment plus monthly fees over a long period (e.g. 36 months), which can make higher-end models more accessible. Some deals include trade-in discounts when you upgrade from an older iPhone.

That said, buying directly from Apple's UK Store remains the cleanest option if you want a SIM-free, unlocked phone. It offers full flexibility: you can switch carriers or use eSIM as needed without being tied to a contract for 2-3 years.

If you are in the market for a new smartphone that will stay current for several years, iPhone 17 offers strong value.
