## Official Starting Price and Storage Options

At launch, Apple lists the base iPhone 17 (256 GB) at €949 in Germany — this is the official retail price in the Apple Store for customers buying the phone outright, without a contract.

For those needing more space, a 512 GB version is also available, priced at €1,199 in Germany.

Thus, for someone in the EU paying full price and choosing the base storage configuration, expect to pay roughly €949. If you opt for the higher-capacity 512 GB model, the cost increases accordingly — to about €1,199. Differences may occur depending on country, taxes, and local retail markups.

#### iPhone 17 Lineup: Prices for All Models

The iPhone 17 isn't just one device — the 2025 lineup includes multiple models with different price and storage configurations. As reported by independent reviewers, the full set of options (in USD) looks roughly like this: standard iPhone 17, then premium models such as and , as well as a thinner model called .

According to one major breakdown:

- iPhone 17 starts at \$799 (for 256 GB)
- iPhone 17 Air starts at \$999 (for 256 GB)
- iPhone 17 Pro starts at \$1,099 (256 GB)
- iPhone 17 Pro Max starts at \$1,199 (256 GB)

Higher storage configurations (e.g. 512 GB, 1 TB, or 2 TB on Pro Max) push the price significantly higher — for instance, Pro Max with 2 TB storage reportedly reaches up to \$1,999.

Under the hood, iPhone 17 is powered by a new A19 chip, promising faster performance, better power efficiency, and improved support for upcoming Al-enabled features in iOS.

On top of that, Apple has updated battery performance and added faster charging options, while making the device more durable and sustainable: the body includes recycled aluminum and the supply chain aims for lower environmental impact.

# Regional Pricing Differences—Why Prices Vary

Although the U.S. base price for iPhone 17 begins at \$799, European customers typically pay more in euros. For example, Germany lists the base model at €949. This discrepancy reflects local taxes (VAT), import duties, currency exchange, and regional pricing policies.

Across Europe, prices vary by country. In some countries the base price may be slightly higher or lower depending on local pricing strategy. According to a recent summary, iPhone 17 base 256 GB costs €949 in Germany and Austria, while in Luxembourg it may be slightly cheaper.

Meanwhile, internal reports from other regions (for instance Russia) show that prices can swell dramatically due to currency exchange and local retailer markups — though those markets often differ significantly from EU pricing.

## Is iPhone 17 Worth Its Price?—What to Consider

For many users, the new iPhone 17 offers a compelling value-to-price ratio. The jump to 256 GB base storage at launch, combined with Pro-level display and camera features in the standard model, means you get many premium features without paying "Pro" money.

If you need very high storage, the Pro or Pro Max variants — while expensive — deliver strong performance, advanced cameras, and longer-term support. That said, if you mainly use your phone for basic tasks (calls, messaging, social media), the cost may not justify the upgrades.

Also, because of regional price differences, buying in the EU can feel significantly more expensive than the U.S. base price — but that's common with flagship devices and local taxes. Decide based on your budget, usage scenario, and whether the added features matter for you personally.
