US Price for 1 TB Storage

Official retail pricing (MSRP) in the United States for iPhone 17 Pro Max is configured as follows:

- 256 GB — \$1,199
- 512 GB — \$1,399
- **1 TB — \$1,599**
- 2 TB — \$1,999 (the maximum configuration)

Thus, the 1 TB model sits exactly in the middle of the storage / price scale for iPhone 17 Pro Max in the U.S.

Price vs. Value: Is 1 TB Worth \$1,599?
