Why iPhone 16 Pro Price Usually Falls After a New Release

How Much Did iPhone 16 Pro Drop in Price in 2025

The 2025 release cycle provides a clear example. At launch, iPhone 16 Pro (128 GB) cost about \$999. Over the months leading up to and following the iPhone 17 debut, prices for 16 Pro dropped — in some cases sharply.

Third-party retailers began offering refurbished or "renewed premium" 16 Pro units at substantial discounts. For instance:

- Refurbished 256 GB 16 Pro units on Amazon dropped to roughly \$834.99 significantly below the original price.

As a result, 16 Pro becomes available mostly through third-party retailers, refurbished marketplaces, or resellers — which naturally drives price competition downwards.
