What's the iPhone 17 Price in the UK — 2025 Update & Buying Guide

Official UK pricing for iPhone 17 (SIM-free)

According to the official UK store, the standard iPhone 17 starts at £799 for the 256 GB version. If you want more storage, the 512 GB version is priced at £999.

It's important to note that for 2025 Apple has dropped the 128 GB base storage option — which used to be standard for "base" iPhones. Now the 256 GB version is the new entry-level, giving users more breathing room for apps, photos and videos.

Other models in the iPhone 17 line and their UK price range

The iPhone 17 is part of a broader 2025 lineup with several variants — if you want more features, bigger storage or premium functions, you might consider one of these:

- **iPhone 17 (base)**: from £799 (256 GB) / £999 (512 GB)
- iPhone 17 Air: starting around £999 for 256 GB, with higher-storage options available.
- iPhone 17 Pro: begins at approx. £1,099 for 256 GB.
- iPhone 17 Pro Max: flagship model, starting ~£1,199 for 256 GB.

Thus, depending on model and storage, you can expect the least expensive iPhone 17 option around £799, and the top-tier Pro Max reaching significantly higher — though with added functionality, performance and storage capacity.

Buying on contract or with a carrier vs buying SIM-free

In the UK, many carriers and retailers offer iPhone 17 not only SIM-free but also as part of monthly contracts, which can significantly change the effective cost depending on your data and plan preferences.

For example, some deals let you pay monthly for handset + plan, sometimes including data allowances, texts and calls — which spreads the cost out. Others offer trade-in promotions to reduce the upfront price or monthly rate.

That means if you don't want to pay the full £799/£999 or higher upfront, contract plans could make the iPhone 17 more accessible — though you should always check long-term cost and contract terms before committing.

Why the pricing changed: storage shift and lineup restructuring

One of the major changes with the 2025 iPhone lineup is that the "base storage" has doubled. The company removed

the 128 GB entry-level variant; now 256 GB is standard. This gives more space out of the box — useful today when apps, photos, videos and system updates eat storage faster than before.

Because base storage doubled, base price naturally increased compared to years when 128 GB was included. On the flip side, buyers get more value — i.e., double storage for price not drastically higher than previous base models.

Also, the 2025 lineup includes new variants (like the "Air" model) and more storage options for Pro versions — allowing users to choose according to their needs and budget, rather than being forced into "minimum storage only".

What to check before buying iPhone 17 in the UK—and whether it makes sense

If you consider buying iPhone 17 in the UK, here are a few practical points to review.

- **Storage needs**: 256 GB is the base now—if you take many photos/videos, record 4K video, or keep lots of media apps, 256 GB gives more comfort than 128 GB used to. Choose 512 GB if you need extra space or plan to keep the phone for several years.
- **Budget and payment method**: If £799-£999 upfront feels high, a contract with a carrier possibly with trade-in can spread payments over time. Make sure to calculate the total cost (phone + plan) over the contract duration.
- **Unlocked vs carrier-specific**: Buying SIM-free gives flexibility if you travel or want to switch carriers easily. Carrier-locked deals may be cheaper short-term but limit flexibility.
- Alternatives in the lineup: If you don't need Top-end features (camera, ProMotion, storage), the base iPhone 17 is the sweet spot. But if you're a power user doing heavy photo/video, gaming, long-term usage higher-end models might be worth their premium price.

For 2025, the iPhone 17 represents a balance: modern hardware, enough storage by default, and a clear pricing structure that reflects Apple's updated strategy. Starting at £799 for a 256 GB SIM-free model, it gives plenty of room for typical users — and still sits below the cost of Pro versions.

If you value a clean iPhone experience without paying extra for Pro features you may not use, the base iPhone 17 is a solid choice.
